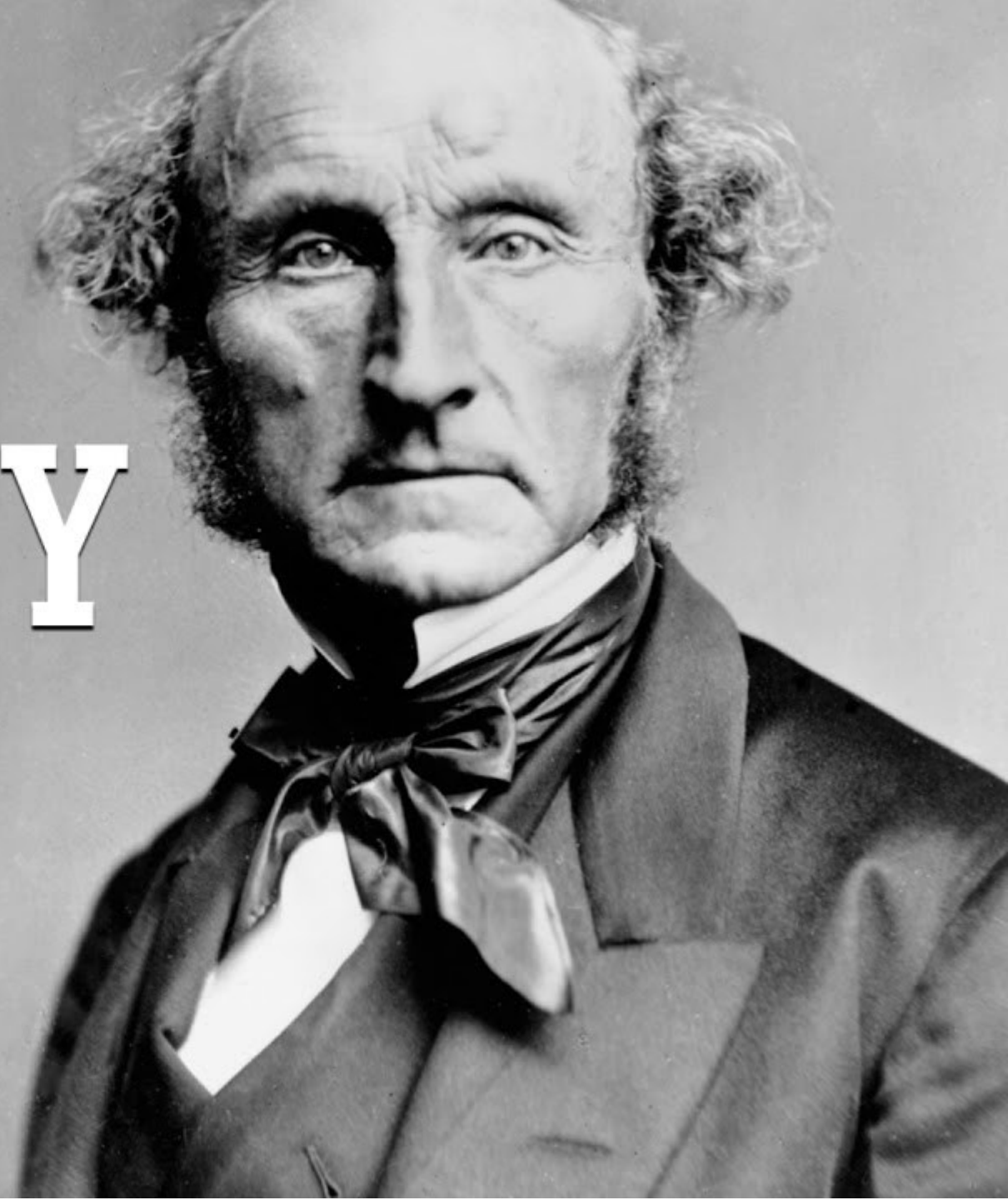

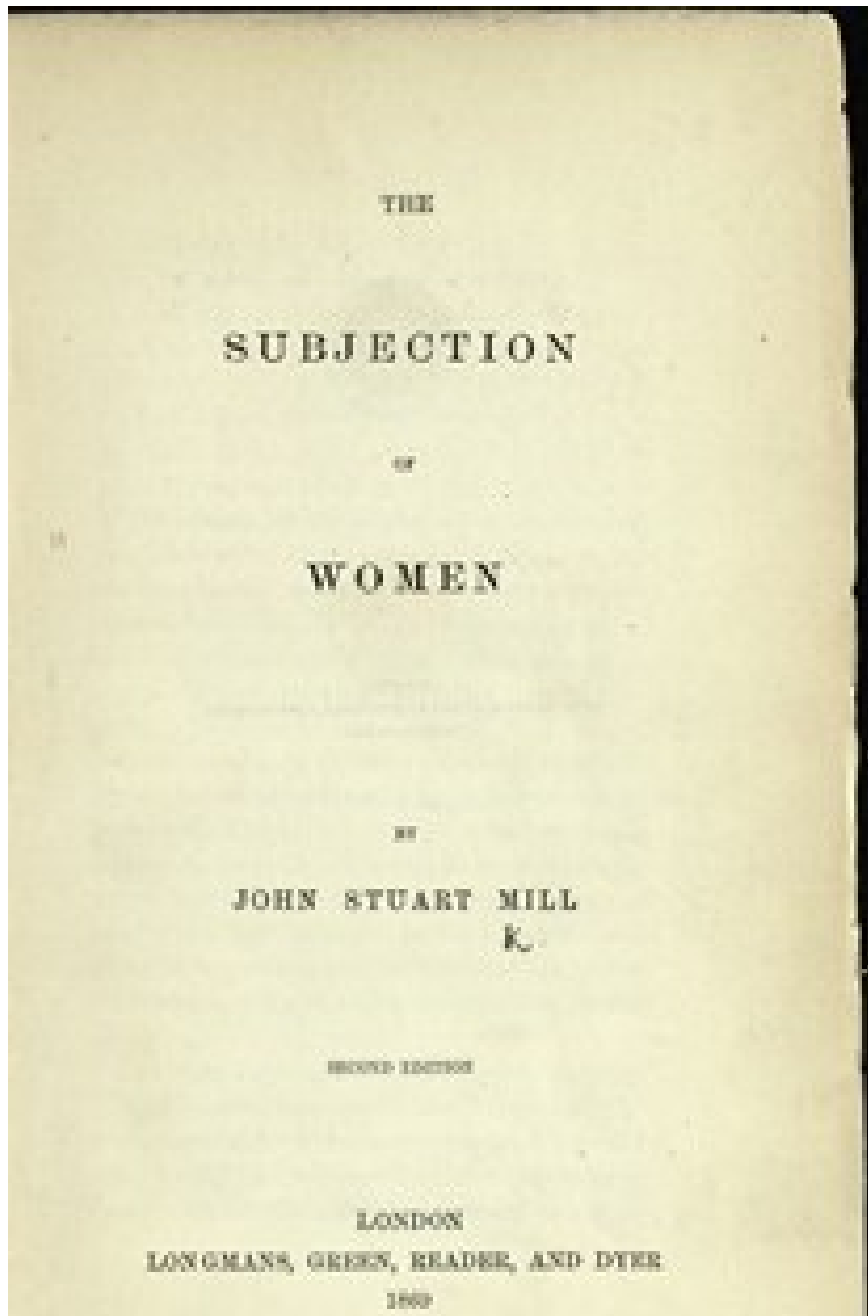
John Stuart Mill



*The only freedom which deserves
the name is that of pursuing our
own good, in our own way, so long
as we do not attempt to deprive
others of theirs, or impede their
efforts to obtain it.*

The only part of the conduct of any one, for which he is amenable to society, is that which concerns others. In the part which merely concerns himself, his independence is, of right, absolute.

*The only purpose for which power
can be rightfully exercised over any
member of a civilized community,
against his will, is to prevent harm
to others.*



1866 John Stuart Mill presented a petition to the House of Commons of over 1500 signatures which had been collected by the Women's Suffrage Committee in favour for women's suffrage

*The reasons for legal intervention in
favour of children, apply not less

the lower animals.*

*If all mankind minus one were of one
opinion, and only one person were of
the contrary opinion, mankind would
be no more justified in silencing that
one person, than he, if he had the
power, would be justified in silencing
mankind*

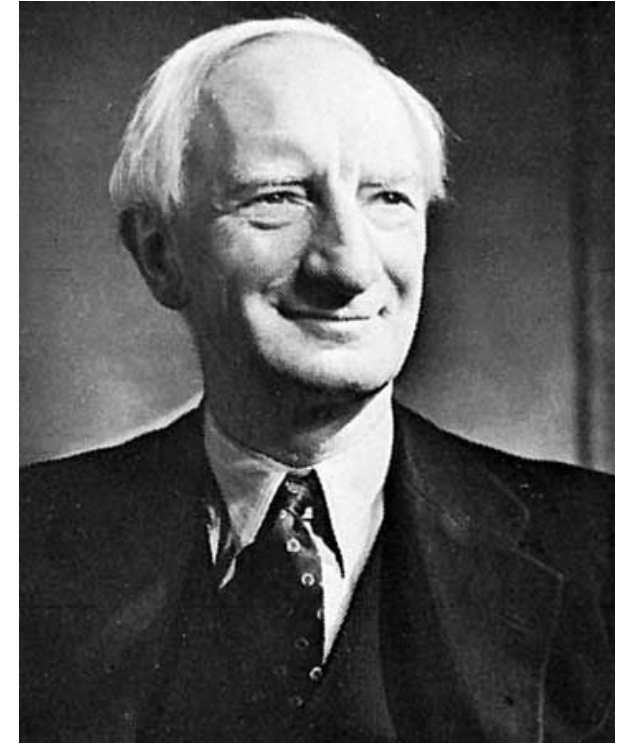
Not 'liberation from each other' (Auer)

- Mill hoped for

the association of the labourers themselves on terms of equality, collectively owning the capital with which they carry on their operations, and working under managers elected and removable by themselves

Not 'wealth creation' (King)

If the earth must lose that great portion of its pleasantness – which . . . the unlimited increase of wealth and population would extirpate from it – I sincerely hope . . . that we humans will be content to be stationary.

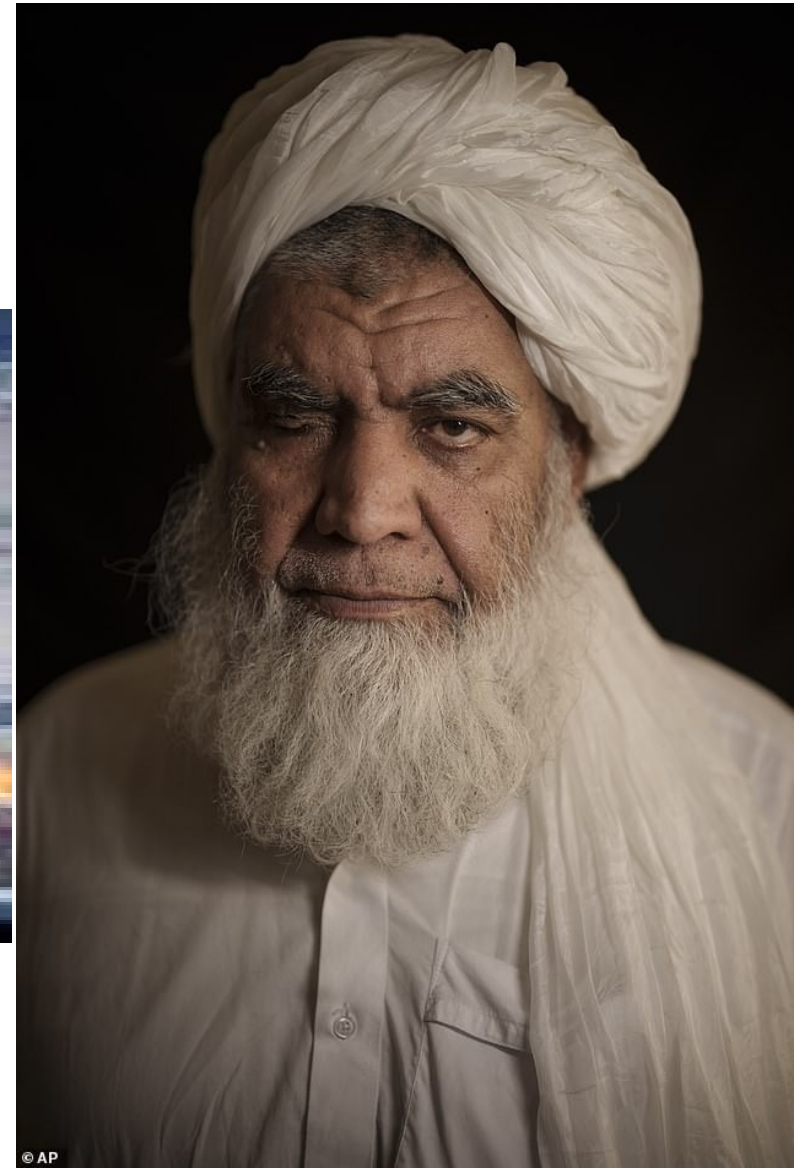

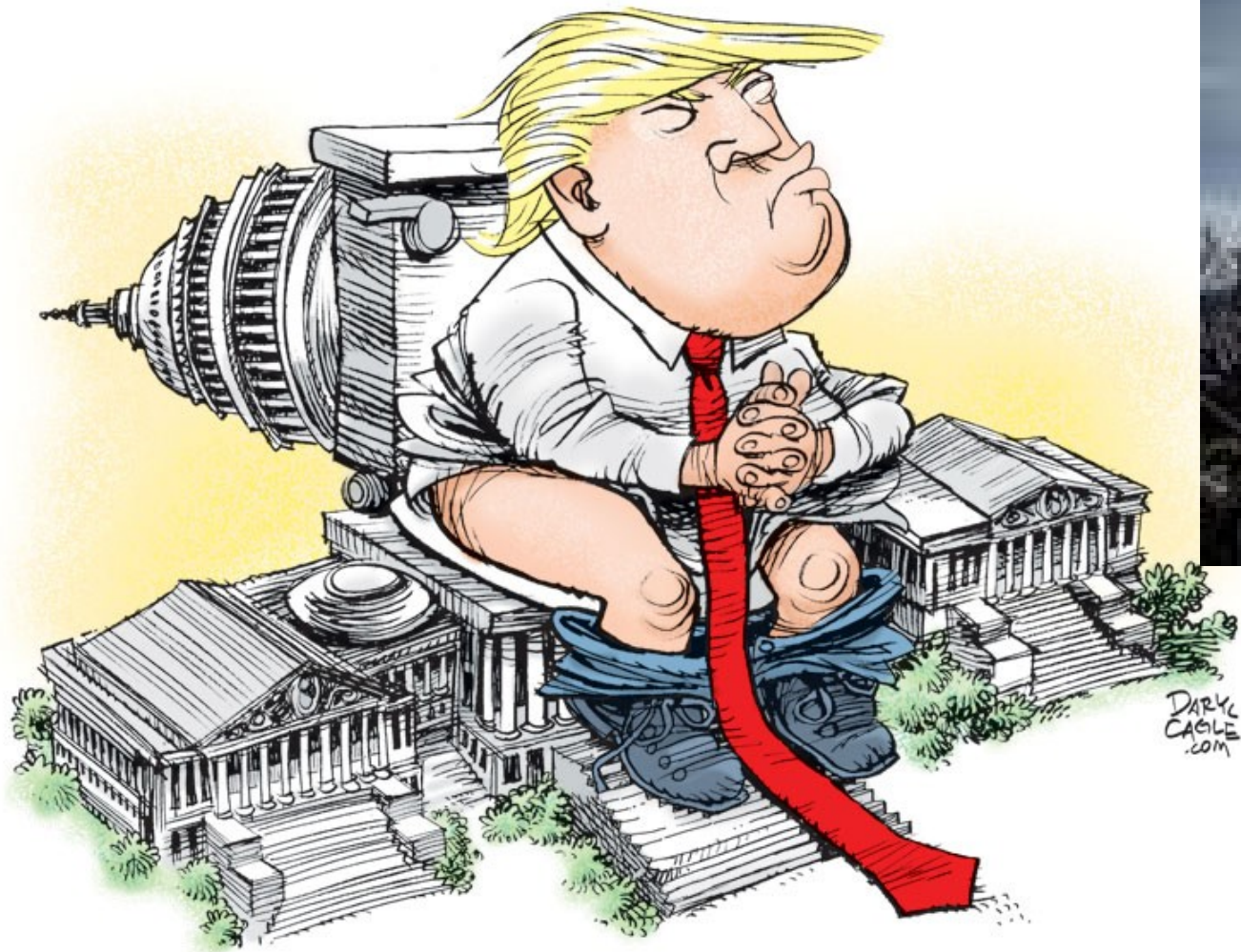
